The Gladstone Area Promotion and Development Limited (GAPDL) was originally founded in 1983 charged with the job of supporting the development of the local business community and promoting the region as a tourist destination.

In 2004 GAPDL were appointed as the Facilitating Partner (FP) for the Department of Social Services (DSS) Communities for Children (CfC) project. These combined projects have enabled GAPDL to take on the task of supporting and promoting the region as a great place to live, as well as a great place to visit.

The CfC FP model means GAPDL are responsible for identifying local needs, and developing an Activity Work Plan (that needs to be approved by DSS) that includes the appointment of contracted organisations or individuals (known as Community Partners) to provide services/supports to meet these needs.

The GAPDL then oversee these Community Partners, being accountable to DSS for the delivery and reporting of programs and services, in line with the approved Activity Work Plan.

As the CfC Facilitating Partner, GAPDL, are required to establish and maintain an Advisory Committee specifically for the CfC project. This committee assists in the development of the Community Strategic Plan, Activity Work Plan, and to guide and support the funded activities.

Committee members are representatives of the local community including clients, parents, local businesses and local service providers. Communities for Children Facilitating Partners aim to build on local strengths to meet the local community needs.

The 2021/2022 financial year saw confirmation from the Department of Social Services that funding for the Communities for Children project will be guaranteed for another five years.

While we are very thankful for this commitment from the Federal Government, the level of core funding granted no longer meets the demand for supports and services in the region, and inflationary increases are constantly 'eating' into this funding.

We have seen a steady but sharp increase in parents, carers and professionals looking for support and education specific to improved family functioning and increased community participation. The Gladstone region responded to this increased need and in 2020/2021 we were able to secure one off funding from local sources to offer a few additional parenting programs.

In March 2021 we invited the community to participate in consultation sessions so that we could better understand the needs they identified and how they should be prioritised. The sessions provided us with large quantities of information that clearly identified the needs of the community around education, social services, health, recreation and community lead services and supports. This allowed the GAPDL Communities for Children teams to clearly define the needs when calling for Community Partners to meet the priority areas of Families and Children being Safe and Well, Strong and Resilient, and Ready to Learn.

Now we have a better understanding of the needs and priorities, we just need additional funding to be able to deliver the supports and services to meet the ever increasing community demands. It is such a crucial time, when children are growing and developing, to ensure their needs are supported and no one is left behind. Decades of research have shown that children who don't received adequate and appropriate health and wellbeing supports in the early years, grow to be adults who need significantly more support than the general population.

As a membership-based organisation, we know that more can be achieved together than alone. We are excited to offer this new membership that will allow everyone to contribute to the health and wellbeing of children and their families across the region.



Why become a CfC Sponsor or Member?

How it Works

As the Facilitating Partner (FP) for the Department of Social Services (DSS) Communities for Children (CfC) program, the GAPDL staff oversee and support our contracted Community Partners to ensure programs and services are being delivered in line with the community needs.

The GAPDL CfC staff support the community by providing a single location where you can get information on the available supports and services for parents and carers of children pre-birth to 12 years. Where possible, staff will undertake the referral process, reducing the stress for parents and carers who are unsure of what is required.

Funding from the Department of Social Services for the financial years 2021/2022 to 2026/2027 is \$499,700 per year with no provision for inflation, so we know that this funding will be severly stretched. The GAPDL are contributing an additional \$143,630 for the 2022/2023 financial year, with this expected to increase each financial year of the remaining contract with DSS. For the current reporting period (2022/2023) our contracted partners receive \$390,500 in financial and in kind support for the purpose of direct service delivery.

Programs and Resources funded for the 2022/2023 Financial Year

Circle of Security

An evidence based program around attachment. The eight (8) session program aims to help parents to:

- Understand their child's emotional world by learning to read emotional needs,
- Support their child's ability to successfully manage emotions,
- Enhance the development of their child's self esteem, and
- Honour the innate wisdom and desire for their child to be secure.

Circle of Security is facilitated by staff from Strong Communities

Tuning in To Kids

Tuning in to Kids® is an emotion-focused parenting program. It provides parents and carers with skills in emotion coaching, which is about recognising, understanding and managing their own and their children's emotions. When children develop these emotional skills they are better able to negotiate the ups and downs of life.

Tuning in to Kids is facilitated by staff from Strong Communities

Little Steps Multicultural Play Group

A community playgroup supported by a qualified educator. Little Steps encourages inclusion and diversity and to celebrate our differences.

Little Steps provides an opportunity to reduce social isolation sometimes experienced by our migrant and refugee families while also offering the chance to engage in conversational English and to experience play based activities from a range of cultures.

Little Steps is facilitated by staff from Integreat Queensland

Nurture and Nutrition Supported Playgroup

Nurture & Nutrition (NaN) playgroup is a free supportive playgroup facilitated by Circle of Security trained caregivers to increase parenting confidence, develop social skills and family support networks whilst creating nutritional morning teas together to be shared.

NaN is also the mathematical symbol for: Not a Number. This encompasses the meaning of this playgroup; that each individual and family is unique and deserves every opportunity to learn, connect and support the growth of their children.

We welcome children of all ages and each week we offer a different activity and theme for our families to enjoy.

NaN is only partly funded by DSS Communities for Children grant as the current demand exceeds the funding available. NaN is facilitated by staff from Strong Communities

Safe Sleep Space & Nourish Resource

Safe Sleep Space offers a number of services and resources to assist with sleep and settling of newborns, infants and toddlers. GAPDL provide local parents and caregivers with 12 months' access to resources including videos guides to sleep and settling. Video segments include understanding your baby or toddler's needs, cues and capabilities, step-by-step, age specific settling strategies, and safe wrapping and sleeping recommendations.

The Safe Sleep Space and Nourish resource is distributed via CfC Community Partners as well as local services who work specifically with parents and carers of newborns and toddlers.

Our Facilities

The Nutchee Building within the Gladstone Regional Council's Philip Street Communities and Families Precinct is the base location for the GAPDL Communities for Children staff and many of our Community Partners. Construction on the facility was completed in August 2021 with the team moving into the premises in September 2021.



The CfC staff provide reception and greeting services ensuring those visiting the facility see a familiar face no matter what program or support service they are attending or what day of the week they are on site.


There are several spaces within the building that can be hired by the community to facilitate meetings, programs and family based activities.



The facility includes:

- community kitchen
- 8-10 person meeting room
- consultation room with hand basin (suitable for primary and allied health service provision)
- 100sqm of indoor open plan 'play' space
- 52sqm of covered outdoor space (directly off the indoor play space)
- baby change room
- 320sqm of outdoor play space
- disability accessible toilets
